Note to Parentsand Course Participants (Please retain this page for your records);

Below are details on what is required from both parents and course participants while on Junior Sailing Courses at the Royal Cork Yacht Club this summer.

- 1.Sailing courses begin at 9am and end at 4.30pm Monday to Friday.**
- 2.Lunch is usually held between 12.30pm-1.30pm. Course participants are not allowed off site for lunch. Please bring a packed lunch. There are no microwave or hot water facilities for course participants.**
- 3.All course participants are requested to be in their wet gear ready to go on the water at 9am.**
- 4.All course participants must provide their own wetsuit, dinghy boots, buoyancy aid (life jacket), waterproof spray top, warm, dry clothing for on land, sun cream and water. Course participants must bring their lunch and snacks with them.**

There will be days when weather conditions will prevent some or all course participants going on the water. This cannot be avoided and shore-based activities will be organised in lieu. For this reason, course participants are required to bring dry clothes with them to change into during the day when necessary.

The ISA syllabus for the Small Boat Sailing Scheme (SBSS) is detailed from a link on our website and available from www.sailing.ie. Course participants are encouraged to look at what will be required of them during their sailing course and to get out onto the water to practice skills before the sailing courses begin.
